To help get the homeless Off The Streets, one person at a time.

Off The Streets Bridgeport provides support to the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless in the greater Bridgeport area, operating with:

- 100% volunteers – no paid staff

- No office space

- 95% of funding goes directly to supporting the homeless

TRANSFORM LIVES TODAY

Imagine being homeless in Fairfield County, where security deposits have skyrocketed to \$1,700 — a shocking 30% increase since 2018. For our neighbors in need, this barrier to housing is the difference between a roof over their head and another night living on the streets. Homelessness has increased by 27% from 2022 to 2025. 1 in every 1,000 CT residents is experiencing homelessness.

We can break through this barrier by providing security deposits directly to landlords, along with donated furniture and other essential household items to those we place into housing. With your generosity, as well as various grants awarded to us from local and corporate businesses, charitable foundations, and fundraising events, we have placed 621 individuals into housing since 2014.

HISTORY OF OFF THE STREETS

Deacon Michael Oles - founder and president of Off The Streets and author of two books about homelessness - is a retired U.S. Air Force Colonel with over 34 years of experience as a volunteer and coordinator working with the homeless.

The life-changing event for Oles happened when he saw a homeless man, on a cold winter's night in one of the local Connecticut shelters, give up his bed to another homeless woman. Later, Oles - with another homeless person - spoke to students at a local school about homelessness, inspiring them to raise money for the homeless person to help get them off the streets and into housing. The students' generosity and energy inspired Oles to form Off The Streets.

Since its inception in 2009, Off The Streets has grown from a handful of volunteers to 10 chapters across the U.S. With two chapters in CT - Bridgeport and Danbury - we continue to live out Oles' mission to get those experiencing homelessness off the streets and into housing.

Connecticut's homeless population is growing, latest count shows

Connecticut's population of people experiencing homelessness has been growing for the past few years. This year's count, a one-day census in January, showed a 13% increase over last year.

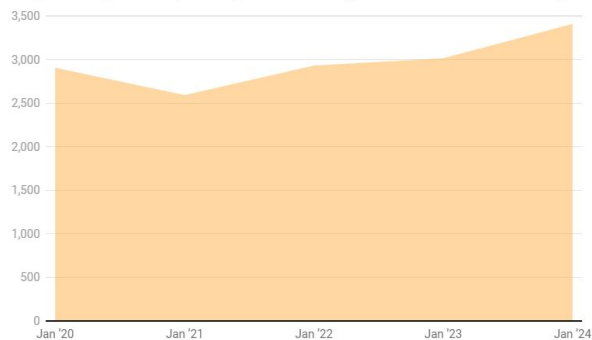

WHO WE ARE

Off The Streets Bridgeport was founded by Deacon Kevin Moore in 2014. Moore was dedicated to helping those in need and treasured the work he did in helping secure homes for those experiencing homelessness. He often met with our homeless clients to help move furniture and household items into their new apartments.

Following his passing in 2019, Off The Streets Bridgeport continues to help place those experiencing homelessness into housing under the leadership of Gerard Agoglia.

Thanks to your generosity, we have been able to place **621** individuals into housing since 2014. As of 2025, the average security deposit we have provided is **\$1,700**
